OCT. 9: DAY OF MERCY IN DIOCESE next Sunday across the Diocese of Salina, the sacrament of Confession will be offered. This day is coined as the “*Day of Mercy*” and is in conjunction with the Jubilee Year of Mercy. At Immaculate Conception confession will be offered from **3:00 to 3:30 p.m.**

From Bishop Weisenburger: While the Sacrament of Reconciliation on our Diocesan *Day of Mercy* is open to all Catholics, we especially ask your help in conveying the information about this special day to Catholics who are marginalized or who have not come to the Sacrament of Confession for a long time. Giving family member, coworker, or a friend a copy of the *Day of Mercy* brochure (or at least the information from the brochure) is a great evangelizing outreach effort! If you already regularly celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, please allow your hurting brothers and sisters in Christ to make use of this special opportunity on Oct. 9th, and plan on celebrating the Sacrament yourself at the regularly scheduled time in your parish. Youth Question: The Gospel story tells us that we are judged by what we do or don’t do for the poor and needy. How are you currently reaching out to those in need? What more could you do?

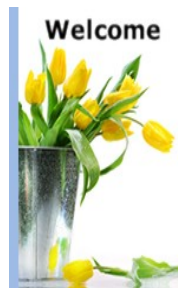
Children Question: Jesus teaches us to share what we have with others. What do you have that you are able to share?
